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
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
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Depression Treatment Without Side Effects

However there has been a lot of criticism in recent years over the amount of medication we are taking. Caffeine and other stimulants should be avoided. They do give you temporary energy but have been known to deplete your serotonin levels. Low serotonin levels are a prime cause of depression.

Take a multi vitamin everyday. This is especially important if your lifestyle causes you to skip meals. Low vitamin deficiency has been linked to depression.

You may want to try getting in touch with your spiritual side. This can be done in a variety of ways. If you enjoy going to church, this is a good opportunity. You may want to look at prayer and meditation as well. You do not have to be overly religious to be spiritual. There are many ways to get there.

Finally, you may want to try getting more exercise. This doesn't mean marathon training. Start out slow and build up if you feel the need. Exercise helps release endorphins which make you feel more empowered. There is also the health benefits attached to more activity.

The natural approach may be effective. It can also have other positive influences on your overall health.

Depression Treatment: Natural Treatments

The natural approach isn't always the best or most effective. However, if the depression isn't severe and the person isn't suicidal or incapacitated, then it is recommended to at least give the natural way a chance.

There are many natural remedies that can be tried before trying drugs and medication. Some have tried that natural remedy known as St. John's wort. This has been known to improve the mood of some depression sufferers without any side effects.

If you lead a stressful lifestyle, then some stress management training could be for you. Stress can be the cause of all kinds of ailments, not only depression. Keeping your stress levels low and learning to deal with highly stressful situations can go a long way in helping your depression.

You may want to try helping others. Sometimes doing volunteer work and helping those less fortunate will help. It can be quite rewarding and can negate some of those negative thoughts about yourself.

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If the natural approach does not work, you should not feel bad. It is fine to take medications if this is what will help. You can at least be pleased for giving the natural approach a try.

Depression Treatment: Helping Someone Else

If someone you love is suffering from depression, it is only natural to want to help. Family members can provide an incredible amount of support for someone suffering from this illness. However, you must know how to be effective. If not the family member could end up doing more harm than good.

Depression Treatment: Talking Therapies

Dealing with depression is difficult and draining. It puts stress and strain on the life of the depressed person as well as those close to him or her. Many types of therapies may have to be tried and tested before any improvement is seen. One such possibility is talk therapy.

Talking therapies can be of a great help when it comes to treating depression. It involved various types of counseling with a psychologist, Psychiatrist or therapist. Talking therapies allow the depressed person to get their feelings out. They also allow for the two people to work together to try to find the root cause for their depression.

Talking therapies do vary but most involve the same key elements. First there is the listening session. The therapist listens to the person's problems. Over time the person develops a relationship with the therapist where they feel they are understood. Next there is the emotional release. This is helpful but cannot be done to often. Letting the emotions out too often can have the opposite effect and lead to further depression. Next comes the advice and guidance. The patient may be able to seek the answers on their own through session and homework. Finally, there is information provided. They are giving information in small bits but as progress is made it can be increased. Depressed people can sometimes have poor concentration and memories so information is given carefully.

Talking therapies can be very effective in treating depression but they do take time. Several sessions may be required and the patient's family may have to be involved. Talking therapies can help mild to moderate depression greatly; however severe cases of depression will usually need a combination of talk and medication.

Depression Treatment: ECT Therapies

Today we know more about depression than ever before. WE have more treatment methods and medications to help people get through this illness and function as normally as possible. Depression is a horrible illness and unfortunately it can take a long time before any improvement is seen. Most therapies and medications take a significant amount of time to work effectively. With all of the therapies that are available there are still a small percentage of people that seem beyond the reach of conventional therapy. For those that nothing else seems to work there is ECT therapy.

Giving ECT therapy isn't a decision to take lightly. It is usually only given when all other avenues have failed. It is also only used for people who are suffering from the most severe forms of depression. Those that are suicidal and those that completely incapacitated by their depression are those that are considered for ECT therapy.

When a patient received ECT treatment, electrical impulses are sent into the brain. This then causes a small seizure to take place. The patient is under heavy sedation while this happens and awakens with no memory of what has happened. Sometimes they awake confused and feeling ill. However, the memory loss is usually temporary.

ECT is repeated 6-12 times at intervals separated by a few weeks. Many patients do feel an improvement after just a few sessions. It is believed that the electrical impulses change the pattern in the brain. ECT has worked on several people and most of the time the effects are temporary.

ECT therapy is given only when absolutely necessary. When it is thought that the depression symptoms need to be taken away immediately, then ECT is a possibility.

Taking Manic Depression Seriously

The Symptoms Of Manic Depression

An extremely common and unfortunately the worst type of depression is the manic form. A person suffers from repeated mood swings and has frequent highs and lows. Behavior takes on an erratic form, and moods can change from happy to sad within seconds. Some people think that Pre menstrual syndrome could be the cause or even stress, but this is not so.

A person can get annoyed over the slightest incident and sometimes it could be something quite unimportant like the flavor of ice cream. Anger and irritability ensue leading to an unpleasant display of words. All this can be a symptom of manic depression. Unfortunately, it could last for a week, and is not limited to just one day.

When a person is experiencing a low feeling, it could be equated with real depression. There are so many negative feelings that go through a person's mind like the inability to enjoy life and people, feelings of hopelessness and guilt, feelings that no one cares for them, panic attacks and acute negativism. Therapists feel that if this persists for over a week, a person can be labeled as manic depressive.

Treatment For Manic Depression

Manic depression is very common and can be severe, but the good news is that it can be treated. It is not necessary to worry about it, but see that the person is in touch with the therapist who can guide him with correct treatment and medication in the right amount. Regular visits are a must, so the person can interact and discuss all his feelings which he may not be able to do with family and friends.

It is possible to get good relief through natural forms of treatment, and this can be looked into as possible help for the individual, but for permanent relief, it is best to consult a cognitive behavior therapist who has the experience in dealing with manic depression and all problems related to the mind. He will be able to diagnose your condition and go deeply into your past and present behavior and find the necessary link to your actions and behavior. He is better equipped to deal

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with the situation, and will prescribe the necessary medication if he feels you need it – regular visits to him will give you a confidence boost and enable you to open up. The Symptoms Of Major Depression

There are so many things in life that can be destroyed by major depression. You do not have confidence in yourself, and this leads to withdrawing from the public and society in general. You become anti-social, and you keep family away thereby destroying relationships. Violence is a part of this depression. If you do not feel like eating, this could affect your physical well being.

Major depressive disorder is the term used for Major Depression. When you are aware of symptoms occurring on a daily basis like sleeplessness, a feeling of worthlessness and a lack of confidence, tiredness and being unable to make decisions even in little matters, and when these symptoms happen for 2 weeks at a stretch, then you know that you are going through major depression.

There are also negative thoughts about oneself and differences in moods and attitudes – for instance, a person may not want to associate with anyone and is basically not interested in the things he took part in previously. There is a general feeling of apathy and listlessness that reflects a negative state of mind.

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The most important symptom to look for is when a person has thoughts of taking his life when a feeling of hopelessness sets in. This is the time that you need to take stock of the situation, particularly with a loved one who needs your help, as the person may not be aware of the situation he is in, and in this case, he desperately needs help.

There is no need to despair, as there is help available and with the correct treatment a person can be cured. Extreme cases will have to be put on medication along with various forms of treatment. Anti-depressants will help in calming the person down, and once that is achieved, he can go on to different types of treatment. The main thing is to seek a specialized therapist who will make the correct diagnosis, evaluate the person's requirements, as each person's needs vary, and put him on the road to recovery.

Getting Anxious Over Anxiety Depression?

Causes Of Anxiety Depression

So many people put an extra strain on themselves by getting into tasks that they take upon themselves, and this naturally leads to stress. It is not only a strain on the body but it affects the mind as well – in severe cases it could lead to a nervous break down. Again, there are others who are hyper active and feel the need to get things done on time and this takes a toll on their health, both mentally and physically. For such people, there is help that they can seek and they can avail of this treatment for anxiety depression.

People who are stressed out because of undertaking a whole bunch of activities which they find difficult to cope with display certain nervousness and behavior that is erratic – they indulge in mood swings as pressure builds up. They need to relax more frequently and face things in a composed manner in order to retain their sanity.

In order to treat yourself, you need to make a self analysis of your thoughts and behavior, so that you can consult with a therapist and get yourself the right cure.

Different Types Of Depression

There are various types of depression – Manic and Cyclothemia are similar because the person has mood swings – they can experience highs and lows frequently. Dysthymia is not as severe, but needs to be treated as soon as possible. Then there is Postpartum depression which involves extreme stress during childbirth and the fear of taking care of a new baby – this also needs to be taken care of at once. There is a depression that occurs during the change of seasons, particularly in Winter – moods change and become melancholy and feelings of irritation and anger are known to haunt a person.

The most common type of depression is Anxiety Depression. While it is normal to worry about every day things, to be continually worrying over anything that happens needs to be dealt with by visiting a therapist.

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GAD is known as a Generalized Anxiety Disorder where a person displays a greater sense of paranoia and is greatly stressed out for no known cause – there are also symptoms that occur like sleeplessness , inability to concentrate and focus, inertia, but the good news is that there is treatment available and when you recognize these symptoms, you should visit a therapist who will diagnose your symptoms and treat it accordingly. Medication may be prescribed, which will help to calm your nerves, so with the right therapist and medication you will be on the road to recovery.

Medication As Treatment

Sometimes doctors prescribe medication for severe forms of depression, but there are many cases where the person does not respond and so medication is not for everyone, but depends on the individual case. Doctors do not prescribe medication except as a last resort, when a person is severely depressed and has thoughts of taking his life, or if a person is delusional and could become violent, and again, if depression returns frequently thus impinging on a person's life.

Medication for depression may be given if everything else has been tried and proved futile, or if a person has not responded to psychotherapy and is violent and cannot be controlled. Doctors will only go for medication after intensive probing into the causes that have resulted in depression – for instance, they will delve into the past and present life of the person, so that they can decide on the best form of treatment. If all else fails, then they will prescribe medication.

Different Types Of Medication

There are various types of medication that may be prescribed – the usual ones are serotonin or benzodiazepine tranquilizers or tricyclics. These medications are prescribed because the quantity of chemicals in the brain is not correct and this results in the neurotransmitters being dysfunctional, which in turn produces a great deal of worry and stress in the person.

There are any number of anti-depressants and tranquilizers that are used to treat a person. But the doctor has to consider each individual's capacity to absorb the medication and decide whether it is suitable. Many medications have unpleasant side effects and therefore it is not advisable to continue them – also some medicines are habit forming, and like any harsh drug, will need to be slowly withdrawn. These drugs are very strong and the doctor will only prescribe them when absolutely necessary.

There are certain drugs that do not have the same effect as anti-depressants – in other words, they do not attack the same chemicals, but they have an effect on the moods and stabilize them.

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Not everyone can take medication, especially if a person is pregnant or if a person is on other medication, then the two cannot mix. On the other hand, there are certain medications that can be safely taken together. Your doctor will advise you as to what is appropriate. As far as possible, it is better to treat the root of the problem with careful counseling, and only if there is no response and the condition worsens, can one resort to medication. As medications for depression are very strong with side effects, many people find it tedious to continue and so give it up. When the condition recurs, they have no option but to go back on medication. Whatever you decide, it is best to consult your doctor and take his expert advice.

Depression

The Different Forms Of Depression

It is extremely difficult to recognize the difference between everyday stresses and anxieties, and actual depression. There are various forms of depression and the underlying causes may go back to the past and a person's childhood. You need to assess your emotions which may include stress, worry and anxiety, and if you feel that it is a little too frequent, then maybe it would be a good idea to do a depression test. Each person reacts differently, and no two cases are identical. Identifying your emotions will give you an insight as to whether you should see your doctor, particularly if you have panic attacks frequently. A depression test will help you to decide whether it is necessary to visit your doctor who will be able to refer you to a physiotherapist so that you will get the help you need.

A Depression Test

By taking a depression test, you will be able to identify your symptoms, because many people do not know that their feelings and thoughts are bordering on the morbid and that they are in a state of depression. Their life is slowly becoming different and it could be due to a variety of factors.

The person who is experiencing depression can take a depression test, or the near and dear ones, as also friends who are unable to discover whether their loved one is actually in a state of depression or not. The test is merely to see whether these symptoms occur for more than 2 weeks, and if they do, then it is a sure sign that you may need to see your doctor who will be able to help you.

The symptoms that you need to look out for are:

Morbid thoughts that come out of nowhere, like feeling that your life is worthless and that nobody cares whether you are around or not, the inability to make decisions, procrastination, feelings of shame, unable to enjoy yourself in a crowd or even with friends, lack of exercising, dislike of being with family, loss of appetite, sleeping too much or not at all, listlessness. If these

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feelings are what you are going through, then a depression test will definitely help you to identify your problem and seek the help you need.

Apart from affecting your mind, depression can affect your physical well being too as well as your interaction with close friends and relatives. Once you have taken a depression test, the next thing to do is to monitor your mood swings, and make a note of your varying changes in behavioral patterns. This could be shown to your doctor who will be able to guide you, and in any case this self analysis is a therapy for your own well being.

Causes Of Depression

Medical Research On Depression

There have been innumerable studies on depression, and various theories have been put forward as to why people fall into a depressed state of mind. The general opinion that has been shared by the medical faculties is that there are a variety of causes that cause depression and it cannot be attributed to any one factor. Research is still going on, and great headway has been made over the years.

Many doctors feel that depression could surface as a result of genes inherited. They feel that certain traits are bound to appear in forthcoming generations. Also, these genes could adversely interfere with the serotonin that the brain produces. Finally, the only conclusion that medical researches can arrive at is that a variety of factors can cause depression, and while eliminating these factors one by one, the person can be treated successfully.

Childhood Experiences

Doctors usually will go deeply into a person's childhood and try and find out factors that could inhibit a person. For instance, if a person has had uncomfortable experiences in the physical or sexual sphere, this could have a direct impact on a person's emotional well being. The future could seem bleak and a sense of worthlessness prevails. Also the person is inhibited socially and tends to isolate himself.

Depression could also be a biological factor. One has to bear in mind that there are chemicals in the brain that help us to guard against danger – our reflexes are able to help us to protect ourselves, but if there is a chemical imbalance, then we cannot react as quickly. Also, keeping feelings dormant only serves to bring out morbid thoughts and feelings and an inability to handle any form of anxiety or stress.

Medical Conditions And Drugs As A Cause Of Depression

There are certain ailments like hyperthyroidism that can seriously affect a person's ability to handle situations regarding a job loss or the death of a loved one. Attacks of panic frequently

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occur, as the person is unable to handle any emotional blow. Handling pain effectively can be difficult under these circumstances.

Drugs like cocaine can have a devastating effect on the brain, and can damage the brain cells, cause attacks of paranoia and produce imbalance, so that the person is in a constant state of nervousness and fear.

The human race is complicated and in order to deal with depression effectively, it is very important to analyze the root of the problem, which may go far back to one's childhood experiences or to certain shocks like the loss of a job or a loved one, traumatic changes in one's life as a result of these devastating losses – all these need to be focused upon and dealt with accordingly, and with the help of medication and treatment available, you will be on the road to recovery.

Clinical Depression Symptoms

Identifying Clinical Depression

The reason it is so difficult to diagnose a person suffering from clinical depression is because a person does not behave in an abnormal manner, like maintaining long silences or not getting ready for the day. In fact, the person may not know that they are depressed, and so it is even more difficult for doctors to pinpoint that a person is in fact suffering from depression.

The main focus that doctors rely upon is to identify the cause. The brain holds the key as it sends messages through neurotransmitters which are in turn controlled by chemicals like Serotonin and Dopamine. These chemicals need to be produced in certain quantities – when this doesn't happen, then the neurotransmitters cannot work. This produces a chain reaction which affects a person's thought processes and finally depression sets in. In order to treat a person successfully, it is important to find out behavioral patterns, both past and present. Maybe the person does not want to meet people socially which he was doing in the past.

There could also be physical symptoms like a rise in blood pressure or a weight change.

Feelings Of Hopelessness

Other symptoms can affect the mind leading to feelings of hopelessness. Dark and negative thoughts frequent the mind and this exhibits itself in a person's behavior. They feel that life is not worth living. Everything seems worthless and there seems no joy, and there is nothing worthy to anticipate. They dwell on the errors they have committed and seem incapable of leading a normal life. If you are experiencing any of these feelings, then you are probably going through a bad phase of depression, but there is always help for you.

Sometimes a person can behave in a manner that exhibits fear and worry by dissolving into tears or being overly anxious. They may not want to join in any group functions or attend parties, and even if they do, they tend to withdraw into themselves and remain aloof. Or they may refuse to be drawn into any topic as they prefer to be by themselves. Talking tires them, and they feel their energy being depleted.

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There are times when clinical depression manifests itself in very obvious signs like mania, and this definitely requires immediate treatment. If it is not treated, it could only worsen the situation and be a cause for alarm. If your mind is filled with dark and negative thoughts, and you blame yourself for all your mistakes, and do not want to spend time with those who are close to you like your own kith and kin and other friends, and if your body has undergone a change – maybe weight loss or if you suddenly have a medical condition, then you should visit your physician who will refer you to the right doctor who can evaluate your needs and help you accordingly.

Chronic Depression

Various Forms Of Treatment For Chronic Depression

This form of depression lasts for a while, maybe even 2 years, and a person experiences this on and off. It doesn't really go away completely but keeps coming back, even though it may not be in a severe form.

Doctors and therapists try different methods of treatment like group therapy and counseling before putting a person on to medication. Some people respond and can thus avoid anti-depressants and medication, but if all else fails, the only option is to go for medication which is not really a permanent solution.

Chronic Depression Known As Dysthymia

Dysthymia which is the form of chronic depression is not a severe illness, and does not keep you dysfunctional, but it exhibits itself in different forms, mainly lack of concentration, hopeless feelings regarding life, tendencies of taking one's life and a complete lack of confidence. These feelings remain with a person daily and may last for long periods of time, even years. Although you can go on with your life, these sad feelings cramp you and make you feel that your life is worthless.

Dysthymia can occur at any stage of a person's life – it is not restricted to any particular age group – it could affect both young and old alike. Since there are no visible symptoms that affect bodily functions, and a person is able to discharge his duties, it is extremely difficult to pinpoint. But, this condition cannot be neglected, as it will not go away by itself, so treatment has to be sought to set the condition right.

If the treatment is sought early, it will arrest the condition and prevent it from escalating into something so severe that it will have to be treated with anti-depressants and drugs which are very strong and may need to be continued almost permanently. Many doctors have come across cases that do not respond to treatment, but do not lose heart, as there are various other forms of treatment, and you can consult your physician who will be able to recommend a good therapist who will administer the care that you require.

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The most important thing is to recognize that you are feeling low and that you do not seem to enjoy life, or tend to shy away from people because of a lack of confidence. You also need to assess the length of time that you have been feeling this way, and the symptoms that seem to be surfacing that is preventing you from leading a full life. Once this has been identified, then you can go on to the next step which is seeking the necessary help,

This is something that cannot be ignored, as Postpartum depression can be the root cause of even murder. The mother is unaware of what is taking place in her head and feels the child is responsible for all her physical and mental pain. In order to avoid a tragedy, it is best to seek out good medical advice, be in touch with a therapist who will guide you and help you to move forward with medication if necessary.

What Is Bipolar Depression?

Bipolar depression is the term used to refer to the disorder characterized by major swings in a person's mood. At one moment he may feel elated and confident, and shortly afterwards the feeling abruptly changes to one of defeat and failure. The experience is similar to those occasions when one's feelings of well-being and happiness turn sour at a sudden turn of events or circumstances. The difference is that in bipolar depression, these mood swings occur regularly, sometimes even occurring daily, and without any rhyme, reason or regard to circumstance.

The high points as well as the low points during the mood swings in bipolar depression do approach the extreme ends of the mood spectrum and can often lead to irrational behavior. People diagnosed correctly with bipolar depression often experience euphoric highs and may actually believe they are incapable of defeat or injury. There may be occasions when bipolar persons gamble uncontrollably or decide to go on a shopping spree without any regard for their financial state or the probability of dire consequences that may follow. As the euphoria swings swiftly to a severely depressed state, the memory of a just-ended and short-lived euphoria haunts him and intensifies the depression even more. While such extreme examples are not generally common, lesser degrees of euphoria and sudden depression occurring regularly in an alternating fashion can still be quite confusing and definitely exhausting. There is an endless array of possibilities towards a path of difficulties in the personal and family life.

A person suffering from bipolar depression in the workplace may bring potentially harmful consequences. ECT is repeated 6-12 times at intervals separated by a few weeks. Many patients do feel an improvement after just a few sessions. It is believed that the electrical impulses change the pattern in the brain. ECT has worked on several people and most of the time the effects are temporary.

ECT therapy is given only when absolutely necessary. When it is thought that the depression symptoms need to be taken away immediately, then ECT is a possibility.

They can carry on with an activity provided they stay within 2-3 feet of the box. The light then helps to replace the serotonin levels and helps reduce the chances of depression.

Light therapy has been proven effective in other areas as well. It has been shown to help sleep disorders as well as re-adjust our body clocks.

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possible emotional or sexual abuse (there will be other signs too obviously). Another common cause of childhood depression is an unsuspected learning disability.

Many children are not good at communicating what they're thinking or feeling. That means you have to make an extra effort to "interpret" the situation. There are many treatment options if the self-help treatments don't work. These treatments are similar to the ones used to treat adult depression.

Clinical Depression

Doctors have specific terms for medical issues and clinical depression is one of them. Medical research is always ongoing and the results of the research are published for the medical community. This is true for all medical conditions being studied. The goal is to find cause and cure by first identifying common symptoms. When you have clinical depression it simply means you fit the current definition of what medical science considers true depression.

Once you are diagnosed with clinical depression, a variety of treatment options become available. They include cognitive and behavior therapy, interpersonal therapy and medication. Some components of the therapy can be undertaken by you without a doctor. For example, you can learn to stop spiraling negative thoughts about your abilities and self-esteem. You can keep a journal or make yourself become more active. But for many people, their clinical depression must be treated by a doctor.

Doctors who treat clinical depression often combine medication with one or more of the other therapies. The goal is to keep the medication level as low as possible with eventual cessation. Cognitive therapy has proven to be quite effective as a depression treatment during controlled studies. With cognitive therapy, you learn to start loving yourself by changing your perceptions.

Interpersonal therapy involves counseling which focuses on the people or events involving other people that may have triggered your depression. It can also simply work to improve your self esteem so you have better interpersonal relationships. Behavior therapy, on the other hand, helps you change your self-defeating behavior. You learn to enjoy doing some activities again. Behavior therapy is often used with cognitive therapy to treat clinical depression.

There are several medications commonly used in the treatment of clinical depression. They include selective serotonin reuptake inhibitors (SSRI) and tricyclics. Anti-depressant medications is almost always prescribed when someone indicates they have suicidal thoughts. In other situations, it may be prescribed for a short period of time to give a person a head start on cognitive and behavior therapy.

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Naturally, only medical doctors can prescribe medication for clinical depression. But there are different kinds of psychotherapists who offer the other treatment options. These include clinical psychologists and psychiatrists. Psychiatrists can prescribe medication and provide cognitive, behavior and group therapy. When you have mild depression, you can also utilize the services of a trained counselor.

Clinical depression is depression that fits the mold so to speak. You have all the signs and symptoms of depression as identified through medical research. All depression is treatable and there's no reason for anyone to feel alone or helpless. There are many different options for treatment and they all work. So if you suspect you are experiencing depression, it's important to get help right away.

Depression, a mental illness that is often characterized by prolonged periods of sadness and melancholy, experts from the field of psychiatry say.

So how do you know when taking one of the depression medications is the right choice? Other factors in the decision to use depression medications include religious values, other medications currently being taken, pregnancy and propensity for drug dependency. As you can see, it may be a very complex decision to use depression medications.

There are no quick fixes for depression. You will probably have to take the medications for many months and it will take weeks before you notice a change in your depression disorder. One of the main considerations for deciding to use depression medications is the severity of the disorder. If you have bipolar condition or are depressed at least 2 hours every day, you have severe depression. When you use depression medications, it might be necessary to try more than one in order to get the best drug combination. You also must be aware that most of them have side effects, but these side effects are different for everyone. That's another reason why you need constant doctor supervision.

Depression Test

Another benefit of utilizing a depression test as a barometer of your emotional state is that if you are experiencing depression, it may be hard for you to define your symptoms.

The depression test is merely a checklist of symptoms you identify as being applicable to your situation. It can be amazing how many people are actually unaware they have a mild case of depression or don't realize how much their life has changed due to depression. There are so many manifestations of depression that it's impossible to list them all.

The depression test can be used by the person who suspects they are experiencing depression or by family or friends who aren't sure how to recognize depression in someone they love. It's important to identify depression as early as possible, because depression will get worse. The general rule of thumb is to consider if you have experienced several of any of the following symptoms for longer than 2 weeks.

- Thoughts your life is spiraling out of control
- Believing your life is unimportant
- Convinced no one would miss you if you were to die
- Can't make any decisions – even small ones
- Don't anticipate anything at all as being enjoyable
- Feeling ashamed all the time
- Experiencing frequent and unexplained crying
- Can't enjoy being with friends or attending events
- Stopped exercising

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- Giving up things once enjoyed
- Avoiding people whenever possible
- Feeling alone all the time
- Doesn't enjoy being with family anymore
- Feeling like no one understands you
- Losing appetite
- Unable to sleep or sleeping too much
- Having no energy

The depression test can include many more symptoms, but this gives you a good idea of the kinds of things you would take into consideration. As you can tell from the list, depression affects a lot more than just your emotions. It can affect your body and your relationships too.

Once you take the depression test, the next step is to begin tracking the mood changes. By creating a mood diary, there's now something very tangible and quite convincing to show a doctor or therapist. It also provides you a clear picture of what's happening and that can be very therapeutic in itself.

Finding The Right Depression Medication

Before getting started with depression medication, the depression patient must first get him or herself to a reputable doctor, get a diagnosis of which type of depression the patient is actually suffering from, may it be clinical depression, manic depression or what-have-you. It's best that you're sure what you're actually dealing with since there are various depression medications that are available in the market, you should make sure that you get the most appropriate one, the one that'll actually cure your depression illness.

There's actually a wide variety of anti-depressant depression medications available to help treat those who are suffering from depressive disorders. The more popular ones are those that are of the selective serotonin reuptake inhibitors or SSRIs variant then there are the tricyclics while the other popular variant is the monoamine oxidase inhibitors or MAOIs. These depression medications (the SSRIs variant as well as the other newer depression medication available in the market) actually to be a much safer alternative than the tricyclics, since they have fewer side-effects as opposed to the tricyclics depression medication variant.

Anti-anxiety or sedatives however, should never be mistaken as depression medication. There are actually some common side-effects from depression medication, usually coming from the tricyclic variety. Headaches: quite common with the newer kinds of depression medication, it's really not a big deal and will actually go away easily.

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Insomnia: first-time users may actually experience this depression medication side-effect but it usually just happens during the first few weeks of taking the depression medication, asking your doctor to lower the dosage of the depression medication may actually help you with this side-effect, as well as the time of day wherein you take your depression medication can actually have something to do with your sleeping problem.

Manic Depression

Manic depression is a disorder that's also called bipolar disorder or manic-depressive illness. It's a mood disorder, but it's one of extremes. The term manic depression comes from the word mania which refers to the extreme highs and lows someone with bipolar disorder experiences. Bipolar disorder does not get better on its own and must be treated. There are numerous medical research studies being conducted in the area of manic depression, but current treatments often include medication.

With depression, you experience mostly, if not only, low feelings. With manic depression you experience extreme moods ranging from the most euphoric to the deepest depression. During the euphoric stage, the person is very happy and high-strung. The attention span is short, sleep is difficult, and it's hard to concentrate. Of course, everyone is different. The euphoric and depression highs and lows can be fairly mild in some cases, but the behavior during these periods can be devastating to a family. A manic depressive can cause great financial and interpersonal problem between family members. Unfortunately, people with manic depression can also experience mood swings within short periods of time. It's even possible to experience both euphoric and depression at the same time.

There are many different things that can trigger episodes of manic depression. They include drug use and a traumatic experience such as a death in the family. There are various treatments used for bipolar disorder. One of the most common is prescription medications that stabilize moods or serve as antidepressants. Another common treatment is counseling sessions with a therapist. A therapist can assist a person with manic depression in identifying

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when euphoric or depression episodes are about to happen. The goal is to determine if there are certain things which cause the episodes to happen. There are other treatments, but those are the most common.

Postpartum Depression

Postpartum depression has been a disorder society has had a hard time accepting. After all, when you have a baby it should only bring great happiness to your life. Yet, being pregnant and having a baby is also a time when the body goes through enormous stress and hormones are produced in excess amounts. In most women this may cause some minor and unpredictable mood changes, but in others it's quite possible it creates postpartum depression.

Though hormones are the suspect, there's no definitive proof yet that hormones are the only culprit. Postpartum depression is a very serious disorder that affects women within weeks of giving birth. For some women, the depression begins after only a few days.

Postpartum depression becomes apparent when the new mother has difficulty accepting responsibility for the new infant. There may be lack of interest in the baby or quick irritation when the baby cries. Other symptoms of postpartum depression include the following.

- Unable to sleep
- Feelings of inadequacies
- Exhaustion
- Inability to cope with baby care
- Despondency

The interesting fact is that a woman go complete an entire pregnancy with no signs of anxiety, and then develop postpartum depression after birth. Some cases of postpartum depression are severe and include unexplained and frequent crying and even thoughts of suicide. The new mother has trouble functioning and can't seem to complete the smallest chores. Also, some women show lack of interest in the infant.

It's an unpleasant subject, but postpartum depression has been determined to be the cause of a mother injuring the infant or infant siblings. In the severest cases, postpartum depression can develop into a psychosis. A psychosis means the woman is probably hallucinating or has lost a grip on reality. In many of these cases brought to court, the new mother claims she heard voices telling her the baby or her other children must be killed.

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The only reason this is discussed is because it's important to understand that postpartum depression is very real and must be treated. Ignoring the disorder does not make it go away. Fortunately, there are treatments that work well. In most cases, medication is prescribed by the doctor.

If you suspect you, or someone you know has postpartum depression, you should see a doctor immediately. Most women will experience some mild depression after the birth of a baby due to shifting hormones or the realization this child is now a continual responsibility. Before a baby is born, women gets lots of concerned attention from family and friends. Once the baby comes, and the mother is doing fine, the attention stops and the work begins. But postpartum depression is a serious disorder that must be dealt with before symptoms worsen.

Psychotic Depression

Psychotic depression has several common symptoms. They include the following.

- Hearing voices
- Delusional thinking
- Hallucinating
- Paranoia
- Delusions

When you have psychotic depression, your reality is different from others. You may believe space aliens are talking to you on your cell phone. Or you think the voices you hear are telling you to harm yourself. Obviously, you should not try to treat this type of depression on your own. Treatment will probably require some hospitalization and most certainly medication.

There is a new type of medication being used in cases of severe depression. It's called atypical antipsychotic. They have worked in cases where SSRIs and tricyclics have not proven effective. This is good news for those with psychotic depression, because they often help those with the severest forms of depression. Unfortunately, they do have many possible side effects. A person taking one of these drugs must be monitored at all times. The side effects include the following.

- Facial tics
- Weight gain
- Movement problems
- Hypertension

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- Blurred vision

This is not a comprehensive list, but gives you a good idea of the kind of side effects people are experiencing as a result of using the atypical antipsychotics. Unfortunately, when a person is hallucinating or has become suicidal, the use of medications is necessary even with the unpleasant side effects. Psychotic depression is a very serious disorder that can't wait for the perfect treatment to be discovered. The good news is medical researchers are constantly looking for alternative treatments for psychotic depression.

Treatment for psychotic depression will be long and complicated. This is not something that can be handled easily which is why it must be treated by a doctor. When someone is psychotic, they cannot monitor their own treatment until they reach a certain level of mental wholeness.

If you or someone you know is experiencing any of the symptoms listed above, it's imperative you seek treatment from a doctor. Though it's a complicated disorder, it's treatable most of the time. The doctor will probably prescribe medication in addition to another therapy such as group therapy or cognitive therapy. No one needs to suffer with this disorder alone when there are so many ways to treat psychotic depression.

Signs of Depression

There are so many different signs of depression which means it sometimes continues until the indications form a pattern. But the sooner you recognize depression in yourself or someone else, the sooner you can get treatment. Depression needs to be treated whether it's mild or severe or anything in between the extremes. Depression doesn't disappear on its own and will only get worse.

There are some basic and common signs of depression. They include the following.

- No feelings of self worth or low self esteem
- Doesn't like to be around other people which can include family
- Doesn't anticipate doing anything including enjoyable events
- Lack of concentration
- Feelings of hopelessness
- Feeling sad all the time
- Suicidal thoughts
- Inability to make any decisions

A person can have one or more of these signs of depression. It's natural to feel sad for a few days or to have stressful days. It's normal to have some days when life may seem a little harder than you think it should be. Depression is something entirely different. It's not natural to feel you are worthless or that people in your life wouldn't miss you if you were to disappear. It's not normal to be sad for longer than two weeks while continuing to experience constant fatigue and lack of interest in anything around you.

The signs of depression can be very noticeable in many cases. Someone who is depressed may cry a lot for no apparent reason. In severe cases, a person may refuse to get out of bed. In milder cases, the person might be unable to make the simplest decision or constantly feels guilty about something. People with depression can have trouble functioning at work or at home.

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Other signs of depression may not be severe and are harder to identify. For example, you can experience depression triggered by an event such as a death in the family or loss of a job. It can be a real shock and not everyone is able to adjust well. You might still appear to function normally but the signs of depression are there. You might cry at the most unexpected times or begin a spiral into despondency that makes you unable to function eventually.

On the other hand, bipolar disorder has very obvious symptoms. While in a euphoric state, bizarre behavior such as making obviously foolish and harmful decision becomes apparent. While in a depressed state, the person feels hopeless and all the frenetic activity stops. This happens over and over again and can even happen within a day.

The key to identifying if someone is depressed is to watch for patterns or continual worsening of suspect symptoms. If this goes on for longer than 2 weeks, you should get professional help for you or your friend or family member.

The Tell-Tale Symptoms Of Depression

People who may be suffering from depression or manic disorders actually exhibit or show each and every kind of symptom of depression that doctors will tell you that depressed people have. Sometimes it's actually quite easy to overlook such symptoms and not be able to help one's self or others who are suffering from depression for that matter.

There are actually a lot of symptoms of depression that depressed people may actually possess but they don't have to suffer from each and every one of them before you actually help them get diagnosed and be treated for this illness. Also, since symptoms of depression actually vary, the time of their "attacks" varies as well.

Here are some common examples of symptoms of depression:

Prolonged period of sadness or not feeling "up to it," people who are always feeling not in the mood, who'd rather mope around the house and feel sorry for one's self is the best example for this symptom of depression.

Feels hopeless, perennial pessimist: speaking of feeling sorry for one's self, another common symptom of depression is when a person actually feels like he/she has nothing to look forward to in his or her life. As for being the perennial pessimist, those who show this symptom of depression are usually very negative about things, again, the feeling of hopelessness comes in to mind.

Guilt-driven, loss of self-worth and helplessness: other symptoms of depression that can be easily seen on people who prefer to mope around all day long are these. Whenever a person feels so guilty over something, that actually makes one a very sad person who feels like he or she doesn't deserve to be happy. Thus, the loss of self-worth, if that person feels like he or she isn't worthy of being happy or enjoying one's self then that's clear tell-tale symptom of depression. Helplessness also contribute to being depressed, when assuming that things won't simply go your way, it's already a clear saying that you have absolutely no hope in your body at all.

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Isn't interested in finding or taking pleasure; just dropping the hobbies as well as the other things that one used to enjoy: this tell-tale symptom of depression just shows how depressed a person can be, if one is actually too sad to take pleasure even in the very things that one loves then that person is seriously lacking something, rather, that person might well have caught the depression bug.

Fatigue, always tired: people suffering from depression, since they've lost whatever interest in life that they may have had before are actually lacking of physical energy at all times, if one would prefer to just mope around, probably won't even eat not get enough sleep, a depressed person may well be on their way to not just a mental illness but depression can actually be terrible for one's physical health as well.

Having trouble concentrating, having bad memory and is indecisive: a person who is suffering from depression easily gives away this tell-tale symptom of depression. Wherein one's lack of interest with regards to the outside world or for just about anything for that matter can lead to that person's inability to lose track of things and actually not be able to remember things that happened or what other people said. Lack of interest actually makes depressed people very inattentive.

There are actually more symptoms of depression that can actually help you see if a person (or you) needs to be brought to the doctor to get some help when it comes to depression: lacking sleep, sleeping too much or waking up at wee hours of the morning are all symptoms of depression (if it happens on a daily basis), appetite loss as well as eating too much may show one's lack of enthusiasm for life. Be weary of sudden weight loss or weight gain in those around you. Being suicidal, talking about death, about wanting to die is another clear indication that that person is depressed. Being restless and irritable and physical symptoms that are usually brought about by poor mental health such as headaches, digestive disorders and various body pains.

Teen Depression

Sometimes teenagers can be hard to interpret because they have many normal ups and downs as they grow into adults. But teen depression is a growing problem as evidenced by the increasing number of teen suicides. It's also not unusual to hear parents of teenagers involved in violent acts in the schools say the teens had been depressed. But it's sometimes hard to differentiate between the normal emotional variability due to hormonal changes and true depression.

As parents of teenagers, it's important to watch for changes in behavior that don't make sense and seem to worsen as times go by. For example, teenagers that have always enjoyed being with friends and then suddenly stop socializing may be experiencing depression. Losing interest in activities is one of the major signs of depression. Teen depression may reveal itself in other ways too.

- Loss of interest in sports activities when sports have always been important
- Sudden drops in grades at school
- Change in eating habits such as loss of appetite or ravenous gorging
- Comments indicating low self-esteem
- Sudden fluctuations in moods

It would be nice if an adolescent would just tell a parent exactly what he or she is thinking and feeling, but that often doesn't happen. Instead the parents have to be acutely aware of unusual behavior that indicates something's not right in their child's life.

There are ongoing medical studies trying to find physical reasons for teen depression. There has been a correlation found between obesity and depression. That only makes sense when you consider the symptoms of depression in children. For example, an obese child can have feelings of low self worth due to peer taunting. Teenagers who are depressed may eat a lot of "comfort food" seeking solace for their feelings of isolation. Teenagers can also be

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experiencing problems at school and not be telling the parents at home. As a parent you think things are going well only to discover there's been an ongoing problem between students or student and teacher.

Adolescents can be very sensitive human beings. The teenage years are formative years, and when problems in socialization occur, it can be very demoralizing. In addition, sudden mood swings can also indicate there's another problem in the teen's life. If a teenager is being abused physically or sexually, teen depression can be the response.

Identifying teen depression can be difficult, but never impossible. When you suspect your child may be experiencing teen depression, you should try to talk to the child first. If the adolescent won't talk to you then professional therapy may be in order. It's important that some kind of treatment be instituted, because the lack of self esteem can be devastating. Depression deepens and doesn't just disappear once he or she reaches adulthood. Your teenager can become a depressed adult next.

Treatments For Depression

There are many treatments for depression and usually more than one is used at a time. The most common treatments today include the following.

- Cognitive therapy
- Group therapy
- Medication
- Behavioral therapy
- Interpersonal therapy

Most of the treatments for depression include keeping a journal as a first step and even an activity log when the depression is severe enough to prevent you from completing critical activities. A log can be an important tool for both you and/or your therapist in order to identify the triggers of depression. It can also be a good way to get your life back on track.

One of the benefits of using journals and logs in the treatments for depression is that it forces you to undertake an activity to improve your life. This can be very important when depression has interfered with your ability to think or function normally. For example, if you keep a log of what you're feeling and of your thoughts, it becomes easier to identify the negative thinking that spirals out of control. A journal can reveal things such as feelings of failure or anxiety. With the identification of the thoughts, a therapist can then help you seek the cause of the lack of self esteem.

An activity log is a useful log during any of the treatments for depression for keeping track of what must be done in your life to keep it on track. People with depression often decide they don't care anymore about any one or any thing. Unfortunately, this can have dire consequences if you don't pay bills or deposit money in your bank account. Some people with depression don't just neglect themselves either. They neglect important tasks such as picking up the kids at school. They can even decide eating is too much trouble. That's why some people with depression can have sudden and severe weight loss.

When people get depressed, the mind focuses on dark and deep thoughts that are usually self-critical. If you tell yourself you're unable to do anything right, the next logical thought is: why

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try? That is how depression works. It gets deeper and deeper if left untreated. Except for medication, the treatments for depression assist people with changing their thought patterns so they see themselves as capable and positive.

It's hard for someone who's never had depression to understand how deep the mental hole can get. When you keep a journal and activity log, you can learn to set simple goals that are easy to meet. The slow decline into the black hole is reversed so you can begin the upward climb to the light. It's done one step at a time. There's no instant cure for depression. Even medication takes time to work.
